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A clinician may be required to make a diagnosis for a client and record it onto the Rio electronic patient record.

Accessing a Diagnosis

- Click **Menu**
- Click **Quick Menu**
- Click **Client's View**

Search for Client using Client ID, NHS Number or Demographical data.

Clinical Portal – Client's View screen will display

Locate the Navigation pane (right)

- Click **Case Record**
- Click **Diagnosis**

The Diagnosis screen now displays and will show any current diagnosis recorded.

Adding a Diagnosis

- Click **Add Diagnosis**

A Diagnosis term (for example Epilepsy) will need to be entered into the **Add Additional Diagnosis** field; any matching diagnosis will be displayed automatically inserting the appropriate code below

- Click **Code:** Z82.0 (example)
- Select **Code/Code Description** and the details will turn blue
